

Here's what you can do:

1 Prevent Poisonings.

Store medicines and household products in their original containers.

Lock medicines and household products where children cannot see or reach them.

Use child-resistant packaging. Replace the caps tightly after using a product.

Read the label before taking or giving medicine, every time.

Use household products according to label directions. Mixing household products can release dangerous gases.

Install a carbon monoxide alarm.

The Most Dangerous Poisons:

- medicines: iron pills, prescription and non-prescription drugs
- pesticides
- windshield washer solution
- antifreeze
- drain cleaners, toilet bowl cleaners
- alcoholic beverages
- lamp oil, furniture polish
- gasoline, kerosene, paint thinner

First Aid:

- **SPLASHED in EYES?**
Rinse with water for 15 minutes.
Call Poison Control.
- **SPILLED on SKIN?**
Rinse with water for 15 minutes.
Call Poison Control.
- **BREATHED in a poison?**
Get to fresh air. Call Poison Control.
- **SWALLOWED a cleaning product?**
Drink a glass of milk or water. Call Poison Control or log on to poison.org.
- **Anything else?** Call Poison Control.

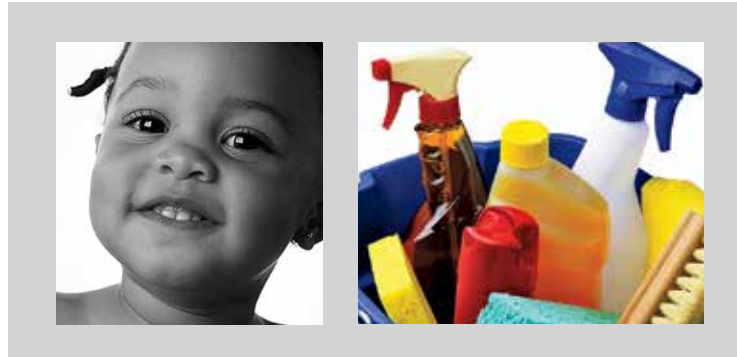

We work to prevent poisonings.

Reported poisonings are monitored for new or unusually dangerous hazards. When we identify a problem, we urge manufacturers and government regulators to change the formulation, improve the closure, or even ban the product. Poisoning data can also be used to detect a chemical or biologic terrorism incident. Should such an incident occur, the Center is ready to respond by providing information to the public and health professionals.
