The National Capital Poison Center is recruiting board-certified medical and clinical toxicologists for the positions of Medical Director, Managing Director and web**POISON**CONTROL Editor. All positions are onsite in Washington DC.

The National Capital Poison Center is the accredited poison center serving the DC metro area, with a phone service handling 39,000 human poison exposures annually. The Center is a 501(c)(3) independent not-for-profit corporation with its own infrastructure and finances. Staff are employed by The George Washington University, with generous University benefits and faculty opportunities through the Department of Emergency Medicine. The Center, with its spacious facilities and in-building parking, is located in northwest DC near American University in a mostly residential area, just above several restaurants and a deli. 3) <u>Poison.org</u> – a compendium of poison information for the public with 9000 visits each day.

4) <u>The Poison Post</u><sup>®</sup> – a quarterly e-newsletter focusing on poison prevention topics.

The Center's structure as an independent charitable organization offers unique opportunities for flexibility, autonomy and programmatic control. You will have the chance to guide the program in the direction *you* choose, work with outstanding CSPIs and dedicated administrative colleagues, and focus on the objectives you believe are important to the future provision of poison control services.
